ADVOCATES ACT 1995

NOTARIES REGULATIONS 2000

Coming into operation - 1 January 2001

Approved by Tynwald - 12 December 2000

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Deemsters by section 29 of the Advocates Act 1995(a), section 27 of the Interpretation Act 1976(b), and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, the following Regulations are hereby made :-

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Notaries Regulations 2000 and, subject to section 29(4) of the Advocates Act 1995, shall come into operation on 1 January 2001.

Application for licence to act as a notary public

2. (1) An application for the issue of a licence to act as a notary shall be addressed to the Chief Registrar.

(2) The application shall be made in writing and shall contain the information specified in the Schedule.

(3) The written application shall be accompanied by -

- (a) two references as to the character of the applicant and his suitability to be a notary public; and
- (b) such further information and documents as the First Deemster may require.

Issue of licence

3. The First Deemster shall consider each application received by him and shall, in relation to every application for a licence -

- (a) issue the licence; or
- (b) issue the licence, subject to conditions; or
- (c) refuse the application.

INFORMATION TO ACCOMPANY APPLICATIONS FOR A LICENCE

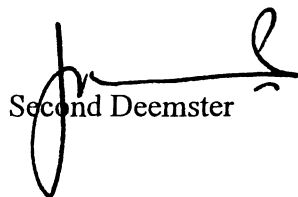
1. Full name
2. Home Address
3. All business addresses
4. Present occupation
5. Qualifications (professional qualifications, degrees, etc. identifying subject and institution which awarded the qualification or degree)
6. Details of training in notarial law and practice
7. Details of experience in notarial law and practice
8. Details of any convictions or cautions for any criminal offence
9. If the applicant has ever been adjudged bankrupt, made any composition with his creditors or been sued to judgment for any debts, full details
10. Details of any proceedings, penalty or composition in respect of any failure to pay, or any other default relating to, VAT or any form of tax, rates or duties
11. Details of any action brought against the applicant personally or his firm or business in respect of professional negligence without the matter being dismissed
12. Details of any disciplinary process (including proceedings which have been commenced but have not yet been completed) involving the applicant personally or a person under his supervision without the matter having been dismissed
